NEW YEAR'S DAY BIRD COUNT

Place of YOUR choosing on Tuesday, January 1st

This has gotten to be a tradition for our club, so we are putting this in our December newsletter to give you a heads up. Start your 2019 out right by making a New Year's Day Bird List at the place of your choosing. This is not a group field trip nor is it a competition, just a great way to start the year out. If you haven't participated before, maybe this will be the start of a new tradition for you!

Make a note of all bird species seen and/or heard beginning midnight of New Year's Eve (which would officially be January 1st) and ending 11:59PM of January 1st. January 13th, SUNDAY at 2PM

Sewage Treatment Plant and Surrounds

Meet co-leaders Kent Davis (355-6388) and Linda Cory (580-5214) at the Greenway parking lot on Bennington St next to the bridge over the Roanoke River. After a short scan of the Roanoke River, we will carpool over to the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP). Entrance to the STP is by special permit and only on Sundays, and trip participants must all enter at the same time and stay together as a group. This site is one of the best spots for viewing shorebirds in the Roanoke Valley. The property includes impoundments, sludge ponds, mudflats, riparian habitat and wood-lands. Besides shorebirds, we can expect to see resident hawks and possibly ravens and fish crows. The walking is mostly flat with a short steep trail. Sturdy waterproof boots are recommended as it could be muddy. If time permits, we will also look for birds at Mayflower Park and/or the end of Rutrough Road.

Directions: Thirteenth Street SE changes names to Bennington St at the bridge over the Roanoke River which is in front of the STP. Look for the Greenway parking lot next to Brownlee St.

January 26th, Saturday, 9am

Pond Hopping in Botetourt

Meet our co-leaders, Tim and Alyce Quinn (312-6844), at the parking lot next to Bojangles at Botetourt Commons on Route 220 in Daleville. We will spend the morning visiting local ponds in search of waterfowl and other avian life. Carpooling is required due to the limited space at some pull-off areas. Bring your scope and dress warmly.

Directions: Exit at 150B on I81 and follow signs to 220N, keeping to the right of the traffic circle. Go 3/4 miles and take a left on Kingston Rd into the Botetourt Commons shopping center. Bojangles is next to the Wendy's in the parking lot.






February 1-3, 2019 VSO Field Trip Outer Banks
